

# Welcome to Mystery Weekend

Langley's Mystery Weekend began in 1984, based on the game of "Clue," with a handful of actors and co-writers. The idea was to bring visitors to town during the dead of winter.

From 1990 to 1999, writer Chris Crotty wrote the mysteries. Since 1999, Loretta Martin has been our chief mystery writer, with help from other cast members. This year, veteran actor Rachel McDougald penned the story, with back-up from Loretta Martin and fellow actor Mike Hill.

Now in its 39th year, Mystery Weekend involves the entire community in the fun. The Langley Chamber of Commerce organizes all the parts of the production. Business owners purchase clues and donate prizes. Community members play the parts in the story, and they make their own costumes, often raiding the local thrift store for costume parts.

Josh Hauser, who has owned Moonraker Books for over 50 years, is the only original performer left now, having performed in every mystery for 39 years! She plays Mayor Josh DeFax, who was appointed mayor in 2023, after former mayor C.Z. Cash eloped with retired Texas Ranger I.B. Fuzz. Taking I.B. Fuzz's place is her nephew Texas Ranger Chase Ketchum, played by Ben Parks.

Many of you sleuths have also been with us since the beginning. Year after year, dedicated mystery-solvers convene in Langley for another round of goofy fun. If you're a veteran, welcome back. If you are new to Mystery Weekend, we hope you'll become a regular too.

# Meet the Author Rachel McDougald

Rachel may be the only writer in Langley Mystery Weekend history who started out as a "suspect." She, her husband Joe, and their son Sean, have been volunteer actor/characters in the mystery for



thirty years. Because of this "on the streets" knowledge she always brings the actor's perspective to the writing of the mystery. In 2020 Rachel was the lead writer for the Mardi Gras themed mystery.

"The writers provide the framework but the actor/ characters (all volunteers) bring the story to life. All the costuming is theirs, the props, their characters' spontaneous arguments, and the other goofy 'shtick,' all of it comes from them. They are out on the streets all weekend in the cold or sun or wind or rain or even snow. The hopeful mystery solving "sleuths" come up with some weird questions the actor/characters never saw coming such as genealogy, food preferences, even leg length. The "suspects" need to be ready for everything. They share the truths they know, the twists in the story, and even some 'lies' they make up on the spot," said McDougald. "After all, one of them is the murderer and has every reason to direct suspicion on another character!"

Rachel shared some personal facts about herself:

- She doesn't function without coffee
- She names the worms in her compost pile
- She can usually parallel park on the first try
- She makes a wicked chili
- She firmly believes jet lag can kill
- She prefers dogs to people
- She won't peel carrots
- She has participated in Mystery Weekend for 30 years along with her husband and son
- She hates "Meet the Author" pieces.

### The Silence of the Mime

This year's mystery centers on, essentially, a talent contest. In the story a PR firm has been hired to select 12 individuals to act as a Langley Host for one month. Each month advertising will feature a different individual and theme promoting Langley and its businesses. For example, January's host might focus on the town's artistic history, giving tours of our architecture, galleries, and teaching classes on chainsaw carving. March might be about our performing arts highlighting upcoming plays and teaching juggling and busking. June might be about water sports, kayaks, and windsurfing with classes in teaching your dog to paddleboard.

First though hosts must be chosen, and our PR guru is holding a series of group auditions. Those hoping to land a spot will gather twice a day during the weekend and they will be taught a brief dance. The PR guy doesn't care how well they dance but it allows him to look for individuals with the charisma, joy, goofiness, energy and the attitude he wants.

The town is awash with Langley-ites in ridiculous costumes practicing their juggling, showing off their paintings made by bugs and trying to coordinate their kazoo band – anything to get attention. Anything?

As the audition days draw near a windstorm hits town knocking down trees and power lines and ripping holes in roofs. It's not all bad though, A Buncha Dufus Roofers are on the job!

In the midst of this craziness, we have a murder! A local businessman, dressed as a mime, and practicing his unicycle skills, is run down by a car with no driver. No driver, and yet it was seen tracking him, turning as he did. How is this possible? Who'd do such a thing? And why?

Read the *Langley Gazette*, gather the clues, visit the scene of the crime and ask the hard questions, then turn in your best guess and join us for the reveal.



The Murderer is revealed at 4:30 p.m. at Whidbey Children's Theatre located at 723 Camano Ave in Langley.


